In 2025 **St. Peter's UCC Cemetery** is celebrating 150 years--A Bit of History September 30, 1894 Pastor William Beck requested the congregation to retain a place for his grave beside that of his beloved wife. It was moved and carried that his request be granted and that both places be given him without cost.

Roy Miller 12/21/1894-11/22/1924 Roy was a pipe worker and later became City Marshall of Washington. In August 1917, he enlisted with the Franklin County/St. Louis County Battery and went into training at Fort Doniphan, OK in the 188th Division. While overseas he took care of the horses, was in 6 battles, gassed and injured (not seriously). Roy attained the rank of Sergeant Field Artillery 35th Division. He died at home from appendicitis.
